In partnership with The Meeting Tree, a Mexican Travel Artelier, this adventure blends ancestral craft, living tradition, and curated connection.










Styling session

Get dressed in the spirit of the celebration — choose from curated outfits, accessories, or makeup looks rooted in tradition and expression.




Private altar photoshoot

Craft your own iconic headpiece with local florists using marigolds and native blooms — perfect for the Día de los Muertos processions.




Personal ancestral tribute kit

Sound healing or temazcal ceremony


Cleanse, ground, and reflect with a guided ritual using ancient techniques by the ocean in Puerto Escondido.
